

**MARYVILLE PARK COMMITTEE  
SPECIAL MEETING MINUTES**

DECEMBER 5, 2005

The special meeting of the Maryville Park Committee was called to order by President Shoup at 6:04 P.M. on December 5, 2005, at the Administration Building. Members present were Carol Frerker, Diana Hedrick, Cindy Jones, Sharon Petty, Harland Scheibal, Roger Shoup and Chris Stanley. Members David Cluphf, Al Ebert, Ron Motil and Judy Wiemann were absent. Also in attendance were Trustee Liaison Todd Bell and Mayor Larry Gulledge.

President Shoup opened discussion of the calendar of events for 2006 by suggesting the members take each event and date from the 2005 calendar in order. Each event and date was discussed with the following results:

Petty and Frerker told the Committee they will continue with the New Year's Day Walk. The Committee decided to set the date for January 1 from 1:00-3:00 starting in Drost Park and ending at the Senior Center with light refreshments to be served.

The Art/Photo Show will be held again on March 5 from 1:00-3:00 at the Senior Center with Petty and Frerker co-chairing the event. Inclement weather date will be March 12<sup>th</sup>.

The Go Fly A Kite date will be April 22 from 1:00-3:00 in Drost Park with Shoup and Ebert co-chairing. The inclement weather date is April 23<sup>rd</sup>.

The Bike Safety Rodeo will be May 6 from 8:30-10:30 at the Firehouse and chaired by Stanley. No inclement weather date was set.

The first Concert In The Park in conjunction with the park donations dedication will be May 21 from 2:00-3:30 featuring the CHS Jazz Band, and held in Drost Park by Pavilion #1. Hedrick will chair the event, and contact Melissa Gustafson-Hinds to set up the date. No rain date was set.

The Kids Fishing Derby will be June 17 from 12:00-2:00 at Drost Park Pavilion #1 with Frerker chairing. No rain date was set.

Concerts were discussed. Gulledge said \$500.00 is expensive for a concert attended by only a few people. Hedrick added that the weather will keep people from attending. Jones said June, July and August are the hottest months and the lowest number in attendance. It was decided to hold some movies in the park and change the times of the concerts that are used to evenings.

The first Movie In The Park will be June 30 starting at 9:00 P.M., and held in the parking lot of the library with the movie shown against the side of the maintenance building. It will be co-chaired by Petty and Jones.

The July 28 event will be a Movie In The Park starting at 9:00 P.M. to be held in the parking lot along the side of the maintenance building. Petty will chair the event.

The Concert In The Park featuring Joey James will be August 20 at 7:30-9:00 P.M. in Firemen's

Park. No chair has been selected.

The final Concert In The Park with the Zydeco Crawdaddy's Band will be September 17 from 7:30-9:00 P.M. in Firemen's Park. No chair has been designated.

The Maryville Pooch Party will be October 8 at Drost Park Pavilion #1 from 1:00-4:00. The time has been changed to 1:00 because participants said more time is needed for church attendance. The co-chairs are Hedrick and Jones.

Cluphf and Frerker will create a running event to be held November 18 at 9:00-11:00 starting in Drost Park.

The Holiday Lighting Contest entry deadline will be December 16 at 4:00 with Shoup chairing the event.

Hedrick is to secure these dates with Comptroller Marvin Brussatti and distribute copies of the Calendar of Events at the January meeting for completion and final approval.

Gulledge said the calendar needs to be sent to Jack Kime to be included in the Maryville Newsletter for January. The newsletter is published in January, March, May, July, September and November. He also said better information is needed. Hedrick will send an annotated calendar for Kime's information. Bell requested a copy for the Web site.

Gulledge distributed information regarding the Madison County Parks and Recreation grant. Various projects were suggested by Committee members including the extension of the walking/jogging path and a pavilion by the playgrounds in Drost Park. It was decided that the different projects mentioned would be more than sufficient to apply for the grant. As usual, the time constraints are close. The Committee is in consensus with having Shoup and Gulledge to choose the projects based on costs in consideration of the \$15,000.00 available, and submit the application by the deadline. Stanley moved and Jones seconded to recommend to the Village Board to apply for the PEP grant prepared by Shoup and Gulledge. The motion passed unanimously.

Being no other business, the meeting adjourned at 7:00 P.M..
