I would like to remind everyone that Election Day is April 5th. The Village of Maryville has elections for three Village Board Trustee positions.

Those on the ballot are:

- Incumbent Todd Bell
Incumbent Rod Schmidt
Incumbent Mike Vallino
Village Resident Rod Spears

Each Trustee seat carries a 4 year term.

If you still need to register to vote, or change your address, the last day to do so is March 8th. We have two registrars at Village Hall available to assist you: Village Clerk Tracy Fenton, and Comptroller Marvin Brussatti. Village Hall is open Monday - Friday 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

Also for your reference, under the Village Clerk section of this newsletter we have included a list of all voting locations/precincts in Maryville.

The Village Board recently passed an ordinance to amend the current sign ordinance with respect to political signs. The ordinance was passed in order to comply with a new State statute regarding political signs which has taken control from municipalities over how long political signage can be left on display on private property. Village ordinance used to regulate the time to 30 days before and 7 days following the election; however the new State statute says municipalities can no longer impose a time limit and signs may be left on private property essentially indefinitely. For this reason, the Village Board chose to regulate the size of signs to no more than 8 square feet in area, and no higher than 5 feet in height. Please be advised, the Village can and will regulate the time limit for display on commercial property; that limit remains at 30 days prior and 7 days following an election.

I encourage all residents to exercise your right to vote. If you have any questions regarding the election or any other matter, please contact Village Hall.

OFFICE OF THE VILLAGE CLERK

Voter registration and change of address may be done at Village Hall Monday thru Friday 8:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. Voting is a privilege, take advantage of it!

In order to register you must meet the following qualifications:

- Be at least 18 years of age
Be a United States Citizen
Live in Madison County
Show 2 types of identification (1 of which must have your current address listed). Also, it is required that you use your Social Security Number (or at least the last 4 digits or your driver's license.)
Been at your current residence at least 30 days prior to the date of the next coming election

The last day to register to vote prior to the April 5, 2011 Consolidated General Election is March 8, 2011. Registrations cannot be taken between March 9th and April 6th. Registration re-opens April 7th.

We also have Notary Publics available to notarize documents for you. Notaries are available Monday through Friday between 8 a.m. and 4 p.m., and the service is free of charge. Please be aware that Notary laws are becoming more stringent. It is a strict requirement that documents be signed in the presence of the Notary. If signatures are on the documents when they are placed before the Notary, you will be asked to re-sign.

POLICE DEPARTMENT

Officer Update

Officer Brian Gessi has completed eighteen months with the Maryville Police Department which completes his probationary period.

Mobile Radio Grant

The Maryville Police Department in October, 2010 received a grant in the amount of \$11, 577 from the Illinois Criminal Justice Information Authority to purchase four mobile radios for squad cars. The new radios significantly improved the reception of our radio transmissions. In February, 2011 the Village Board approved the purchase of four additional radios and now all of our police vehicles will have a mobile unit installed.

Laws Effective 01-01-11

Excessive Speeding

625 ILCS 11-601.5, 730 ILCS 5/5-6-1

Synopsis:

Amends the Illinois Vehicle Code. Provides that a person who drives a vehicle upon any highway of this State at a speed that is 30 miles per hour or more but less than 40 miles per hour in excess of the applicable maximum speed limit established under the Illinois Vehicle Code or a local ordinance commits a Class B misdemeanor. Provides that a person charged with driving a vehicle upon any highway of the State at a speed that is 40 miles per hour or more in excess of the applicable maximum speed limit established by the Illinois Vehicle Code or a local ordinance may not receive an order of supervision.

Company Name On Trucks

625 ILCS 5/12-713

Synopsis:

Amends the Illinois Vehicle Code. Provides that a construction contractor or subcontractor operating second division vehicle commercially in this State that fails to display on the side of the vehicle or its trailer the name of the company for which it is employed is guilty of a petty offense with a fine of not less than \$500.

Sex Offenders in Parks

720 ILCS 11-9.4-1 new

Synopsis:

Amends the Criminal Code of 1961. Provides that it is unlawful for a sexual predator or a child sex offender to knowingly be present in any public park building or on real property comprising any public park. Provides that it is unlawful for a sexual predator or a child sex offender to knowingly loiter on a public way within 500 feet of a public park building or real property comprising any public park. Provides that a violation is a Class A misdemeanor, except that a second or subsequent violation is a Class 4 felony.

False 911 Calls

720 ILCS 5/26-1

Synopsis:

Amends the Criminal Code of 1961. Provides that transmitting a false 911 call is a Class 4 felony.

Tattoo & Body Piercing

720 ILCS 5/12-10.3 new

Synopsis:

Amends the Criminal Code of 1961. Creates the offense of false representation to a tattoo or body piercing business as the parent or legal guardian of a minor. Provides that a violation is a Class C misdemeanor.

FIRE DEPARTMENT

The Fire Department had 92 responses in December. 60 were for medical service with the remaining being for fire / rescue.

The Fire Department had 67 responses in January. 43 were for medical service with the remaining being for fire / rescue.

PUBLIC WORKS

Water Department

In an effort to offer multiple payment options to our citizens and utility customers, the Village of Maryville is happy to announce the following payment options now available:

- **AUTO PAY:** is the Village's newest and easiest free payment option! With Auto-pay your payment is directly withdrawn from an authorized account on the due date specified. An account statement will still be mailed to you, but you will no longer have to worry about writing a check.
- **FCB BANKS** now accept payments. You must have your water bill stub present to make your utility payment.
- **E-PAY** online payments at www.vil.maryville.il.us. E-Pay accepts Mastercard, American Express, and Discover.
- **VILLAGE HALL** payments are accepted in person during normal business hours, or you may use our after hour drive-up drop box.
- **US POSTAL SERVICE** payments may be mailed to Maryville Water Dept, 2520 N Center, Maryville, IL 62062.

Please be advised that per ordinance revisions passed last year, there are set increases for water and sewer through 2013. Below please find the scheduled itemized service increases that will take effect January 1st of each year:

(A) Water service **inside** village limits:

(B) All non-metered residential users of wastewater facilities shall pay a minimum flat rate charge, except in the event use of wastewater facilities is determined by the Public Works Director or his or her designee to be in excess of 2,000 gallons monthly, the Public Works Director or his or her designee may require such flat rate user to install metering devices on the water supply or sewer main to measure the amount of service supplies.

Wood Chipping Program

The Village of Maryville has developed a **Chipping and Limb Removal Program** for Maryville residents. Below are the guidelines established for assisting residents with brush and limb cleanup:

- Brush and limb collections will be the **first consecutive Monday and Tuesday** of each month. (For months starting on Tuesday, collection will be the following week.)
- Residents will need to place all brush and limbs within 10' of the street curbing (Debris is prohibited from being placed on sidewalks or streets).
- Brush and limbs are limited to pieces no larger than 10" in diameter and to be manageable by one man.

- Residents must call ahead and make an appointment for pickup prior to the collection days with the address needing to be picked up.
- **Residents may no longer drop limbs or brush at the tower.** The Village only offers pickup service.
- Residents who would like the resulting mulch (free of charge) may call to make arrangements for pickup.

Mission Statement

The Maryville Heritage Museum is committed to preserving and interpreting the history of the Village of Maryville by collecting artifacts and information that document the heritage of this community.

Through interpretive exhibitions, educational programs and publications, the museum will strive to educate the public of the influence and importance of the past in defining the present.

Preservation of the Building

In 2009 electrical circuits were upgraded and additional outlets put in to accommodate the museum office equipment. The roof was totally replaced that same year, with underlayment boards being replaced at that time.

So who would have thought a killer hail storm in June of 2010 would necessitate the replacement of the roof, again? That was completed in January 2011.

The Museum Committee and Volunteers

Committee members serve in an advisory capacity. They are the decision makers as to which projects will be undertaken in relation to exhibits, and which items to accept into the museum collection.

They are also responsible for determining the annual budget of the committee and approving the expense requests during the year. [Needless to say, final determination rests with the Village Board of Trustees.]

Volunteers work in the museum to accomplish the projects set out by the Committee. At the present time, all volunteers are also members of the Committee. Being a committee member is not a requirement to serve as a volunteer.

Some committee members have also worked on special projects rather than work as museum volunteers. There is a need for volunteers. Each person will find their own niche as they learn what needs to be done combined with their own comfort level in their own skill base. No one has to be an expert in history or museum work. You will learn as you go.

Current committee members include Janet Butts, Jan Cange, Beckie Decker, Ken Kuhlman, Michael Mason, and Sharon Petty. Ed Kostyshock serves as liaison to the Board of Trustees, and has served as the "Founding Father" in establishing the museum.

The Committee meets at 7 p.m. on the first Tuesday of each month at the Museum in the upstairs office. Interested parties are always welcome to attend the meetings. If you wish, call another member to establish a "friend" before you come.

ALLIED WASTE SERVICES

TRASH GUIDELINES

- By law, only **non-hazardous** household **solid** waste can be collected. Liquid waste products **cannot** be collected in a liquid state.
- Non-hazardous liquids can be mixed with an absorbent such as Kitty Litter, but **MUST** be completely dry & with the **lid off the container** to show the driver that it is dried out. Please bag paint cans and place inside your 95 gallon trash cart.

- All services are “curbside” which is placed within four feet (4’) of the traveled portion of the adjoining roadway. For collection please place your cart 3-5FT from all objects.
 - Trash with yardwaste mixed in **cannot** be collected.
 - Loose materials must be bagged and placed inside 95 gallon cart.
 - Rubbish (waste that rots and stinks) should be bagged **AND** the bag(s) should be placed in 95 gallon trash carts. Do not overload the container. If the lid is not closed the trash will be subject to wind and nuisance animals. Do not put any flammable or hot materials in the container.
 - Trash is limited to the 95 gallon cart provided. Additional carts are available for a charge. Please call customer service to order an additional toter.
 - **Bulky Trash** includes any type of solid waste that cannot be placed into the 95 gallon trash cart. There are 2 free city wide bulky trash pick up (dates to be announced). Additional bulky trash pick ups are available at a 3 item limit for a minimum \$50 charge. Price depends on the amount of items out for pick up and is a prepaid service. Bulky trash does **NOT** include major appliances, automobile parts or components, or any other such items.
 - White Goods are to be scheduled for collection through Allied Waste Customer Service **(618) 656-6883**. An additional prepaid charge of \$20.00 per item will be assessed.
 - **Tires and Car Batteries** will not be collected.
 - Medically necessary needles (**sharps**), such as diabetic syringes will only be collected when in approved sharps containers which are available from your syringe supplier or you may use a puncture proof container with a tightly closed lid.
 - **Construction material** or the materials that result from home remodeling projects will not be picked up as part of normal trash or as bulk trash. Some examples of the materials we are unable to pick up:
 - Cabinets
 - Drywall or sheetrock
 - Wood (e.g., 2X4’s, plywood, paneling, peg board)
 - Bathroom fixtures (toilets, tubs, commodes)
 - Kitchen fixtures (cabinets, islands. Etc.)
 - Plumbing (pipes, sinks)
 - Large light fixtures (if the fixture does not fit in a 32-gallon can with the lid secured normally, we are unable to pick up)
 - Roofing material (e.g., shingles, ceramic roof tiles, tar paper, gutters, fascia boards)
 - Siding
- This above list is not all-inclusive. Please contact our Allied Waste Customer Service office to inquire about having construction items picked up for an additional charge.

YARDWASTE GUIDELINES

- Yard waste is a 3 month minimum commitment and is an additional charge to the customer.
- Yardwaste is limited to eight (8) items
- No yardwaste collection during the months of January, February and March.
- Yardwaste with trash mixed in **cannot** be collected.
- Loose yardwaste must be bagged in standard 30-gallon **PAPER** yardwaste bags or placed in designated 35-gallon cans and should not to exceed 50 pounds.
- **YARDWASTE IN PLASTIC BAGS OR BOXES WILL NOT BE COLLECTED.**
- Customer-owned containers used for yardwaste should be marked with a RED “**X**”.

- Any limbs set out for pick up in cans should not exceed 3 inches over the top of the can.
- Tree limbs and branches less than four inches (4”) in diameter must be tied (with **TWINE – NO WIRE**) in bundles no bigger than four feet (4’) long by twenty-four inches (24”) in diameter; however, no bundle is to weigh more than fifty (50) pounds. Limbs and branches four inches (4”) or more in diameter are considered Bulky Trash.
- Christmas trees will be collected at no additional charge the first two weeks of January. The tree must be free of all decorations including tinsel, garland, ornaments and lights. The tree must also be cut shorter than four feet (4’) in length.

RECYCLE GUIDELINES

Every other Week Service: Madison County will provide a 64 gallon recycle cart. Recycle will be picked up every other Friday.

COLLECTION SCHEDULES

Your Customer Service center will advise you of your current collection schedules. In order to insure collection of your trash, yardwaste, and recycling, please put them out for collection at the curbside **BY 6:00 AM on your scheduled collection day.**

HOLIDAY SCHEDULE

There will be no collections on New Year’s Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day or Christmas Day. The change in service days will be for that day on which the holiday falls. If the holiday falls on a Saturday or Sunday no change in weekly trash pickup will occur. – When the holiday falls on a weekday, **ALL** days following a holiday **ROLL**.

For Example:

If the holiday is on a Monday:
 Monday goes on Tuesday
 Tuesday goes on Wednesday
 Wednesday goes on Thursday
 Thursday goes on Friday
 Friday goes on Saturday

CLEAN UP SCHEDULE

The 2010 Spring clean up is scheduled for the week of March 28th through April 1st on your normal pick up day. Large items during clean up dates include furniture, televisions, appliances, mattress sets, large carpets (cut into manageable bundles no longer than 4ft). Allied Waste **cannot** collect tires, car parts, batteries, tires on rims, dirt, gravel, yard waste, tree stumps, liquid material or railroad ties. Concrete, shingles and other construction debris are prohibited. **All items must be placed at the curb by 6:00am.**

CUSTOMER SERVICE: The Allied Waste Customer Service Department is open to receive telephone calls from 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM, Monday through Friday of each week, excluding holidays.
