OFFICE OF THE VILLAGE CLERK

Voter registration and change of address may be done at Village Hall Monday thru Friday 8:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. Voting is a privilege, take advantage of it!

In order to register you must meet the following qualifications:

- Be at least 18 years of age
- Be a United States Citizen
- Live in Madison County
- Show 2 types of identification (1 of which must have your current address listed). Also, it is required that you use either your Driver's License Number or the last 4 digits or your Social Security Number.
- Been at your current residence at least 30 days prior to the date of the next coming election

We also have Notary Publics available to notarize documents for you. Notaries are available Monday through Friday between 8 a.m. and 4 p.m., and the service is free of charge. Please be aware that Notary laws are becoming more stringent. It is a strict requirement that documents be signed in the presence of the Notary. If signatures are on the documents when they are placed before the Notary, you will be asked to re-sign.

For 2010's taxes, the rate for the Village of Maryville will be a tax **decrease**. Maryville's tax rate for 2009 was \$0.9993, the 2010 rate is \$0.9887 resulting in a rate reduction of \$0.0106 per \$100 of your property's assessed value.

POLICE DEPARTMENT
Fraudulent Solicitations

The Federal Bureau of Investigation reminds the public to perform due diligence before giving contributions to anyone soliciting donations or individuals offering to provide assistance to the people of Japan. Solicitations can originate from e-mails, websites, door-to-door collections, flyers, mailings, telephone calls, and other similar methods.

The FBI and the National Center for Disaster Fraud have an existing tip line to receive information from the public about suspected fraud associated with the earthquake and tsunami that affected Japan. Tips should be reported to the National Center for Disaster Fraud, (866) 720-5721. The line is staffed by a live operator 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Additionally, e-mails can be sent to disaster@leo.gov and information can be faxed to (225) 334-4707.

Before making a donation of any kind, consumers should adhere to certain guidelines, including:

- Do not respond to any unsolicited (spam) incoming e-mails, including clicking links contained within those messages because they may contain computer viruses.
- Be skeptical of individuals representing themselves as members of charitable organizations or officials asking for donations via e-mail or social networking sites.
- Beware of organizations with copy-cat names similar to but not exactly the same as those of reputable charities.
- Rather than follow a purported link to a website, verify the legitimacy of nonprofit organizations by utilizing

various Internet-based resources that may assist in confirming the group's existence and its nonprofit status.

- Be cautious of e-mails that claim to show pictures of the disaster areas in attached files because the files may contain viruses. Only open attachments from known senders.
- To ensure contributions are received and used for intended purposes, make contributions directly to known organizations rather than relying on others to make the donation on your behalf.
- Do not be pressured into making contributions; reputable charities do not use such tactics.
- Be aware of whom you are dealing with when providing your personal and financial information. Providing such information may compromise your identity and make you vulnerable to identity theft.
- Avoid cash donations if possible. Pay by credit card or write a check directly to the charity. Do not make checks payable to individuals.
- Legitimate charities do not normally solicit donations via money transfer services. Most legitimate charities websites end in .org rather than .com.

Consumers can also report suspicious e-mail solicitations or fraudulent websites to the FBI's Internet Crime Complaint Center, www.ic3.gov.

Expired and Unwanted Pharmaceutical Drop Box

The Maryville Police Department in cooperation with Madison County and the Team 10 Coalition has placed a Pharmaceutical Drop Box in the lobby of the Maryville Police Department. People can dispose of unwanted medications in liquid or pill form. The medications should be placed in a sealed plastic bag, bottle or original packaging.

NO SHARPS/NEEDLES!!!!!! This is for the safety of the handlers. Sharps/needles should be placed in a marked coffee can or liquid detergent bottle and sealed before putting it into their waste container at home. Should you have further questions, contact Madison County Health Department at 618-692-6200.

UNUSED EPI-PENS/INTRAVENEOUS SYRINGES WITH MEDS ARE OK to place into the Drop Box if they are still in the original packaging.

BUILDING AND ZONING/CODE ENFORCEMENT

Building Permit fees collected in February were \$8,762.37 with an estimated valuation of \$2,895,000. Permits issued:

Summer weather is just around the corner and with that comes problems with tall grass. Village Ordinance states that grass exceeding 8 inches is in violation. Also, a reminder to all businesses and residents located along Highway 159 that you are responsible for the grass between the roadway and sidewalk.

Summer also brings yard sales. The Village recently amended the Ordinance regarding Yard and/or Garage Sale signs as follows:

1. All sales will be limited to a maximum of a three-day period.
2. Limited to four (4) signs per sale, including the sign erected on the sale premises.
3. The signs, which may not exceed 2' X 3' in size, excluding stakes, must contain the following information: (1) address of the location of the sale, (b) the date(s) of the sale, and (c) the address of the person conducting the sale if different from the location of the sale.
4. Signs must be erected with the use of wooden or metal stakes. The signs must be free-standing and cannot be attached to power poles, trees, street signs, or vehicles

5. Signs may be placed on public right-of-way or private property. Signs placed on private property must have the permission of the property owner at the location. The signs must be placed in such a manner that they do not impede or block visibility for vehicular traffic.
6. Signs cannot be placed on Village property or right-of-way adjacent to Village property (parks, cemetery, public buildings, etc.).
7. Signs may be erected on the morning of the day of the sale and must be removed no later than nine o'clock (9:00) p.m. on the last day of the sale. Failure to comply with this provision may subject the person conducting the sale to be cited with an ordinance violation.

Other items to note for summer:

- Storage of trailers, boats, RV's etc. in the front driveway or in the street is a violation. These vehicles need to be stored according to the ordinance.
- Please make sure that all your pets have proper shelter from the elements and access to food and fresh water.

WOOD CHIPPING PROGRAM

The Village of Maryville has developed a **Chipping and Limb Removal Program** for Maryville residents. Below are the guidelines established for assisting residents with brush and limb cleanup:

- Brush and limb collections will be the **first consecutive Monday and Tuesday** of each month. (For months starting on Tuesday, collection will be the following week.)
- Residents will need to place all brush and limbs within 10' of the street curbing (Debris is prohibited from being placed on sidewalks or streets).
- Brush and limbs are limited to pieces no larger than 10" in diameter and to be manageable by one man.
- Residents must call ahead and make an appointment for pickup prior to the collection days with the address needing to be picked up.
- **Residents may no longer drop limbs or brush at the tower.** The Village only offers pickup service.
- Residents who would like the resulting mulch (free of charge) may call to make arrangements for pickup.
- The Village of Maryville will also be participating in the Madison County Christmas Tree Recycling Program. Please contact the Village in late December for more details.

Large Item Drop-Off

Due to high demand, the Village has arranged for two 40-yard dumpsters to be placed at the Public Works Department Shed facility located on Schiber Court from Friday, May 20th through Sunday, May 22nd. Residents of Maryville who missed the recent Spring Large Item Pickup by Allied Waste are invited to place items in these dumpsters at this time. Please remember, Allied Waste is unable to dispose of tires, hazardous materials such as paint or motor oil, or bio-hazardous materials such as used hypodermic needles. - **VILLAGE HALL** payments are accepted in person during normal business hours, or you may use our after hour drive-up drop box.

Get your fishing poles out, dig some worms and come to Maryville's Drost Park on Saturday, June 18 as Maryville Parks & Rec hosts their 11th Annual Maryville Fishing Derby sponsored by Maryville Parks & Rec and SIU-E Bassmasters.

Registration will be at Pavilion #1 at Drost Park off Schiber Court and Vadalabene. Additional parking will be available by Maryville Library.

Any youngster 14 years or under may participate in this free, fun competition. Registration begins at 9:00 a.m. with the Derby starting promptly at 10:00 a.m. and ending at 11:00 a.m. As results are tallied, hot dogs, chips and drinks will be served to all the weary competitors. Awards will be given to the fisherman in each age category for most fish, largest fish, smallest fish and most unusual non-fish. There are six age categories: 3 years and under, 4-5, 6-7, 8-9, 10-11, and 12-14. Numerous attendance prizes will be given away. The derby is a "catch and release" event.

Prior to the start of the competition, at about 9:30 a.m., a local Illinois Department of Natural Recourse biologist, Mark Yehling, will give a special presentation on fishing and water safety. A small gift bag with fishing information will also be provided to each family by the IDNR. Members of SIU-E Bassmasters are a new co-sponsor to the Derby this year. They will be positioned around the lake and help youngsters with their casting skills prior to the event.

All a young boy or girl needs to bring to this event is their fishing pole, bait and a willing supervising adult. ALLIED WASTE SERVICES

TRASH GUIDELINES

- By law, only **non-hazardous** household **solid** waste can be collected. Liquid waste products **cannot** be collected in a liquid state.
- Non-hazardous liquids can be mixed with an absorbent such as Kitty Litter, but **MUST** be completely dry & with the **lid off the container** to show the driver that it is dried out. Please bag paint cans and place inside your 95 gallon trash cart.
- All services are "curbside" which is placed within four feet (4') of the traveled portion of the adjoining roadway. For collection please place your cart 3-5FT from all objects.
- Trash with yardwaste mixed in **cannot** be collected.
- Loose materials must be bagged and placed inside 95 gallon cart.
- Rubbish (waste that rots and stinks) should be bagged **AND** the bag(s) should be placed in 95 gallon trash carts. Do not overload the container. If the lid is not closed the trash will be subject to wind and nuisance animals. Do not put any flammable or hot materials in the container.
- Trash is limited to the 95 gallon cart provided. Additional carts are available for a charge. Please call customer service to order an additional toter.

- **Bulky Trash** includes any type of solid waste that cannot be placed into the 95 gallon trash cart. There are 2 free city wide bulky trash pick up (dates to be announced). Additional bulky trash pick ups are available at a 3 item limit for a minimum \$50 charge. Price depends on the amount of items out for pick up and is a prepaid service. Bulky trash does **NOT** include major appliances, automobile parts or components, or any other such items.
 - White Goods are to be scheduled for collection through Allied Waste Customer Service **(618) 656-6883**. An additional prepaid charge of \$20.00 per item will be assessed.
 - **Tires and Car Batteries** will not be collected.
 - Medically necessary needles (**sharps**), such as diabetic syringes will only be collected when in approved sharps containers which are available from your syringe supplier or you may use a puncture proof container with a tightly closed lid.
 - **Construction material** or the materials that result from home remodeling projects will not be picked up as part of normal trash or as bulk trash. Some examples of the materials we are unable to pick up:
 - Cabinets
 - Drywall or sheetrock
 - Wood (e.g., 2X4's, plywood, paneling, peg board)
 - Bathroom fixtures (toilets, tubs, commodes)
 - Kitchen fixtures (cabinets, islands. Etc.)
 - Plumbing (pipes, sinks)
 - Large light fixtures (if the fixture does not fit in a 32-gallon can with the lid secured normally, we are unable to pick up)
 - Roofing material (e.g., shingles, ceramic roof tiles, tar paper, gutters, fascia boards)
 - Siding
- This above list is not all-inclusive. Please contact our Allied Waste Customer Service office to inquire about having construction items picked up for an additional charge.

YARDWASTE GUIDELINES

- Yard waste is a 3 month minimum commitment and is an additional charge to the customer.
- Yardwaste is limited to eight (8) items
- No yardwaste collection during the months of January, February and March.
- Yardwaste with trash mixed in **cannot** be collected.
- Loose yardwaste must be bagged in standard 30-gallon **PAPER** yardwaste bags or placed in designated 35-gallon cans and should not exceed 50 pounds.
- **YARDWASTE IN PLASTIC BAGS OR BOXES WILL NOT BE COLLECTED.**
- Customer-owned containers used for yardwaste should be marked with a RED "**X**".
- Any limbs set out for pick up in cans should not exceed 3 inches over the top of the can.
- Tree limbs and branches less than four inches (4") in diameter must be tied (with **TWINE – NO WIRE**) in bundles no bigger than four feet (4') long by twenty-four inches (24") in diameter; however, no bundle is to weigh more than fifty (50) pounds. Limbs and branches four inches (4") or more in diameter are considered Bulky Trash.
- Christmas trees will be collected at no additional charge the first two weeks of January. The tree must be free of all decorations including tinsel, garland, ornaments and lights. The tree must also be cut shorter than four feet (4') in length.

RECYCLE GUIDELINES

Every other Week Service: Madison County will provide a 64 gallon recycle cart. Recycle will be picked up every other Friday. See attached for a current list of acceptable recycling materials and pick up schedule.

COLLECTION SCHEDULES

Your Customer Service center will advise you of your current collection schedules. In order to insure collection of your trash, yardwaste, and recycling, please put them out for collection at the curbside **BY 6:00 AM on your scheduled collection day.**

HOLIDAY SCHEDULE

There will be no collections on New Year’s Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day or Christmas Day. The change in service days will be for that day on which the holiday falls. If the holiday falls on a Saturday or Sunday no change in weekly trash pickup will occur. – When the holiday falls on a weekday, **ALL** days following a holiday **ROLL**.

For Example:

- If the holiday is on a Monday:
- Monday goes on Tuesday
- Tuesday goes on Wednesday
- Wednesday goes on Thursday
- Thursday goes on Friday
- Friday goes on Saturday

CUSTOMER SERVICE: The Allied Waste Customer Service Department is open to receive telephone calls from 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM, Monday through Friday of each week, excluding holidays.
